
#### **Member Retention**

Welcome to the Pathways Learning Guide! This Guide will lead you Step-by-Step through selecting a Path and working in that Path. Some important points to understand:


- 1. Learning to master these two processes is critical to your understanding of Pathways and its unique navigation.
- 2. The choices you make here could shape your learning in Toastmasters for your first year or longer. Since Pathways is a self-paced learning experience, you determine how quickly you progress.
- 3. These Step-by-Step instructions are not the only way to navigate Pathways, but they are the simplest and easiest to remember. You may find yourself using this Guide more than once. As you continue to use Pathways, you will discover additional materials and other ways of navigating the program.

This is a Step-by-Step Guide that you can use yourself, but it is best to have a partner, coach, or mentor lead you through the Guide your first time. These experienced Toastmasters can walk you through your Path selection, answer questions, and help you understand the process. If you have not yet been assigned a partner, coach, or mentor, contact the VP of Education of your Chapter, and ask that one be assigned to you!










There are 2 ways to choose a Path:




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
On the **Choose a Path** page:






