# MENCER BASIC GUIDE FOR YOUR ICE BREAKER (The Information Library Has a Very Detailed Outline)

### **ORGANIZE YOUR SPEECH**

Your Ice Breaker is a story about you. The four elements of a good story are:

Interesting topic

(In this case, you are the topic)

- Opening
  - (Brief Introduction family; what you do for a living, pets, fun)
- Body
  - (3 things nobody would know about you unless you told them)
- Conclusion

(Why you want to be a Toastmaster; what we can do for you)

## WRITE IT OUT

Write your speech, memorize the opening and conclusion, and rehearse everything else until you feel comfortable. Ideally, this will give it a natural and spontaneous feel.

## REMEMBER YOUR OUTLINE

Create notecards or an outline with a few bullet points from your speech on one page. This makes it easier to remember the main points of your speech, and you can refer to it when presenting to your club. The goal is to remember your outline and not read your speech word for word.

## PRACTICE

Divide your speech into sections. First, practice your opening. Then move on to the body of your speech, which will include the main points you want to cover. Finally, practice your conclusion. When you feel comfortable with each section, put them all together.

#### TIME YOURSELF

While you practice, remember that your Ice Breaker is 4- to 6-minutes in length. Time yourself. If you are running too close to the time limit, make sure all your points are relevant and on-topic. If you are running short, re-examine the content and elaborate on topics that are under-represented.

The manual also contains the **Evaluation Resource (Evaluation Form),** but you can also download or print it separately and email it to your Evaluator.
