

HOW TO **SUBMIT** EDUCATION AWARDS (The individual member, each project)

Within Pathways, you will evaluate **your** understanding twice. Before and after the speech. The system will then take you to the "Congratulations page!






A few minutes later, you should receive a conformation email.


When you submit for a <u>LEVEL</u> completion (all projects in that level), a pdf will pop up in the system with instructions.


HOW TO APPROVE EDUCATION AWARDS (The approving officer)

Education award notices are received in email after each project is submitted after the TOASTMASTER MEMBER delivered the presentation. A member does this within their own profile. Awards may be submitted by the Club President, Vice President od Education or the Secretary, exclusively. No club officer may submit their own award. Open the email, then log in as Base Camp Manager.




You will have to login to your own personal account and access the Education page as though you were entering your own Pathway. Then on the next page, click on the PENDING REQUESTS button.






This will take you to the pending approvals page. To the far right of the Toastmasters name are buttons to approve or disapprove.




A confirmation email will be sent to the member. While you're in the system, check to see if there are anyone else's requests in case you missed the email.

FOR THE DISTINGUISHED CLUB PROGRAM (DCP)

In order to get **club** credit for growth or the DCP, it will be necessary to log into Club Central (via Leadership Central) through the individual officer's profile. Click on SUBMIT EDUCATION AWARDS. This will bring you to that page. There, you will see a drop down list of all members. Select the appropriate Toastmaster, then select the level below that. Select the review button then the SUBMIT button on the next page. After a few minutes, you should receive email confirmation.





This is done after each LEVEL, not for all individual projects, like Pathways. Apparently, Pathways does not automatically report level completions, so the officers must do it manually in order to get credit for the club.
