3 apps that may help you as a Toastmaster Submitted by Wil Davenport

1. MindMup is a tool that allows you to create mind maps, a visual way to organize your thoughts. I have found it to be a very helpful tool for me as I begin the process of preparing a speech. Here are some pros for this app.



- a. It is free. You can get a premium version but more than likely everything you will need can be found in the free version.
- b. Once you learn a few short-cut keys, the process of creating "Parent", "Child", and "Sibling" nodes becomes quite easy. (See example below.)

- d. The layout of the mind maps is visually appealing and easy to understand.
- e. There are many ways to customize the mind maps including: color coding, adding images, adding web links, adding files, and much more.
- f. Your files can be automatically saved in your Google Drive.
- g. It is easy to convert your mind map into a PDF to share.

2. Elegant Teleprompter for Android is a great tool to use when practicing your speeches. For me, I've found that recording myself giving a practice speech, and then watching it, helps me to grow as a speaker. Often, I write out my speeches and in the initial stages of practicing a speech, I



will read them word for word to get the flow of the speech in my mind. That is where this app comes in. I can write my speech, import it into "Elegant Teleprompter", and then record myself practicing the speech while using the teleprompter. Here are a few pros for this app.

- a. It's free. The free version will do just about everything you could need.
- b. You can move the location of the text on your screen so that it is as close to your camera as possible. That way, it looks like you're looking into the camera as you speak.
- c. You can write your speeches in Google Docs and then import them into Elegant Teleprompter.
- d. You can adjust the speed that the words scroll, the size of the font, and the spacing between lines so that you can effectively deliver your speech.

3. OneNote is an incredible tool with so much functionality that



goes beyond merely preparing and delivering speeches. However, it has several tools that are particularly useful for a Toastmaster.

- a. It is a great way to organize research you may do for a speech. OneNote allows you to easily "clip" web articles and paste them into your notes. You can store all your information in one place so that it is easy to find. Click here (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=SBoDnb1u15s>) to learn more about the "Web Clipper."

- b. OneNote has a built in feature called “Immersive Reader” that can read any text for you that is imported into OneNote. Text to Speech has improved tremendously and the immersive reader is much more enjoyable to listen to. - c. If you are interviewing someone and want to be able to more easily find information in that interview, use OneNote to record your conversations. You can type notes as the interview is recorded and those notes will be synced to your audio recording. - d. Finally, OneNote allows you to annotate pdf files. You can use their drawing functionality to highlight and write on the pdf. Plus, you can type in the margins. [Click here](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OuSVVJMeosM) (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OuSVVJMeosM>) for more details.
